2. Presentation

a. Sustainability - Student Leadership

Student representatives from Tamanawis, Frank Hurt, Sullivan Heights and Clayton Heights Secondary Schools highlighted some of the numerous initiatives within the schools relating to environmental stewardship. They spoke of the efforts of students; the collaboration within schools, the district and the community; the keys to their success; and their hopes for the future.

3. Delegation

a. Surrey Board of Trade - Advocacy Support - Ms. Anita Huberman

Anita Huberman, CEO, Surrey Board of Trade (SBOT) spoke of the Memorandum of Understanding between the district and the SBOT signed last year which strengthens the relationship and collaboration between the two parties in expanding the entrepreneurial support program for Surrey students. She spoke of the opportunities available to K-12 and post secondary students through the SBOT, and the SBOT's commitment to advocacy for education funding and investments in capital infrastructure for schools.

b. <u>Surrey Community Child Care Task Force - Child Care Report - Mr. Gerard Bremault and Ms. Daljit Gill-Badesha</u>

Daljit Gill-Badesha and Gerard Bremault, Co-Chairs of the Surrey Community Child Care Task Force, provided highlights of their report on the Surrey Community Child Care Task Force Update. They spoke of the child care challenges in Surrey, the priority areas, and their initial recommendations to the provincial government.

c. <u>Portables and Modular Complexes - Ms. Chelsea Woo</u>

e. Report on Menstrual Products Planning

On April 5, 2019 the Provincial Government issued a Ministerial Order for all BC public schools to provide free menstrual products for students in school washrooms by the end of 2019, and develop a policy and procedure in this regard. Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, Patti Dundas, presented a report on the district's plan to implement the provision of menstrual products via wall-mounted dispensers and the cost related to this initiative. It was noted that the district does already have these products available to students on a request basis.
