- * The number of indigenous mother languages listed for Canada is 89......
- * Out of these 89 languages, 85 are living and 4 are extinct...... (three from BC origin)
- * Out of 85 Canadian living languages, 14 are endangered
- * Out of these 14 endangered languages, 7 are from British Columbia.

WHEREAS a mother language is vital to every individual's sense of identity and development, and

WHEREAS language is the cornerstone of culture and is the means of communication among people, and

WHEREAS 26 percent of people in B.C. speak a language other than English or French as their first language, and

WHEREAS linguistic diversity and multiculturalism enriches the lives of all British Columbians, and respect, dialogue and dignity are integral to Canadian values, and

WHEREAS British Columbia can act as a leader in advocating for languages of First Nations and those brought by generations of immigrants to British Columbia, including Braille and Sign Languages, by respectfully observing International Mother Language Day, and

WHEREAS many of the 6500 languages in this world will cease to be spoken with the passing of the last generation to speak them, and

WHEREAS at the General Conference of the United Nations Education Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), it was unanimously agreed to observe International Mother Language Day on February 21 in each and every year;

Surrey School District Linguistic Diversities

- *172 Various Mother languages and their speakers have been identified in Surrey School District (In Richmond- 122, In Vancouver 126)
- *60% of Surrey speaks a language other than English at home

Beneficiaries

- *The main beneficiary of this Program are the Children of the Schools.
- *Children are the main carrier of their mother tongue.
- *They can carry the message and uphold their mother languages generations after generations.

BC Model for Implementation of IMLD

Surrey was taken as the Model City for BC Model. Surrey School District was pioneer to accept the Model. It has two parts:

- Part-1:Integretion of IMLD in BC
 This part is to establish/recognize IMLD in various levels of this Province.
 - Part-2: Implementation of IMLD.

This part is to make awareness among the children about IMLD.

Part-1 of BC Model

Integration of IMLD in BC

- *Surrey is the birth place of IMLD. The theme of IMLD was first initiated from here to UNESCO
- *Almost all the Municipalities of Lower Mainland (Vancouver, Surrey, Richmond, New Westminster, Vancouver, North Vancouver etc.) have proclaimed 21st February as IMLD
- *In 2015 the BC Provincial Government has proclaimed 21st February as IMLD
- *Created "Lingua Aqua" a Mother Language Monument in Bear Creek Park, Surrey
- *Every year we celebrate IMLD and Mother Language Festival funded by the City of Surrey

Part-2 of BC Model

Implementation of IMLD

Children are the carrier of Mother Languages.

Therefore, the main component of this Program are the Children of the Schools. Children are the target groups. Schools are the platforms to facilitate.

Almost all School Districts of Lower mainland Vancouver have accepted and introduced IMLD into their School Yearly Calendar

Expected Results of the Model

*Surrey School District has 101 Elementary Schools


Elementary Student Enrolment:

App. 40,000 Students/year

*Once the model is successfully implemented, at least 40,000 students will be aware of their mother languages

Achievements from a 15min trial a school in Richmond

- *Active participation of grade5 students.
- *30 students in the class speaks 18 different mother languages.
- *All said "I love my mother tongue" in their own mother languages.
- *Produced a linguistic class book.
- *All 400 schools students wrote their names and their mother language on leaves and made an "Ances-Tree"
- * Arranged "Mother Language" booth at annual school day on 16th June.
