

SURREY SCHOOL ENGAGEMENT PROPOSED FORMAT

EDUCATION

Riders engage students in plenary discussion about Cancer Prevention – Things you can do to prevent childhood cancers.

Riders talk briefly about what Cops for Cancer is all about, why we raise money and where the money goes.

PHYSICAL FITNESS

Riders challenge each school collectively to walk, run and/or bike 850 km; this is the distance ridden by each rider on the nine days of tour in September.

VOLUNTEER WORK - COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Riders challenge the school to collectively raise enough money to send one child to Camp Goodtimes in Maple Ridge (\$1,500); Middle and High schools are challenged to raise \$3,000.

TIMING

April is Cancer awareness month. We ask all participants to educate others, participate in physical fitness and complete their volunteer work-community engagement between March 7^{TH} and the end of April.

RECOGNITION

To recognize participation, the riders plan to return in early June to celebrate student accomplishments in an assembly format. A FUN "Cops for Cancer" question and answer period will be held between riders and students focused on testing their retention of information presented to them. Select schools will have the entire team return on tour in Sept
