

# Board Report June 12, 2019

As Chairperson, I am pleased to report on the work of the Board of Education since our last report on May 15, 2019.

## **Grandview Groundbreaking Ceremony**

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, the Board was pleased to host the Minister of Education, City of Surrey Mayor and Councilors at a ground-breaking ceremony for the new Grandview Heights area secondary school project. Construction of the new secondary school, expected to be completed for September 2021, will provide 1,500 new student spaces.

#### **MPs Tour of the Welcome Centre**

At the Board/MPs liaison meeting held on April 17<sup>th</sup>, MPs expressed their support of the work being undertaken at our English Language Learners Welcome Centre and were keen to visit the Welcome Centre in person. On May 24<sup>th</sup>, the Board and staff were pleased to provide a tour of the Welcome Centre for MPs where they were able to further learn of the important programs and services being provided and the positive impacts these are having on our local school communities.

#### **BCSTA Special Metro Branch Meeting**

This morning, the Board and Executive together with our Metro area counterparts had the opportunity to meet with the Deputy Minister of Education and his staff to continue the conversation regarding the ongoing Operating Grant formula review process. In addition, the 2018/19 Operating Grant funding announcement and capital planning were also discussed.

#### **BCPSEA Regional Meeting**

On June 6<sup>th</sup>, trustees hosted the British Columbia Public School Bargaining Association for a regional meeting of school boards to receive an update on provincial bargaining.



#### **Budget Consultation 2020**

Earlier this month the provincial government released its 2020 Budget Consultation Paper. Each year, the Select Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services holds province-wide consultations for all people in BC to provide input. The Board will participate in the consultation through a written submission to the Committee this month.
