# Dual Credit

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- Post-secondary programs or courses that students can participate in and receive high school course credit and post-secondary course credit simultaneously.
- The district offers a number of dual credit and partnership programs for students in grade 11 or 12.
- This includes opportunities that are academic, as well as trades focused.



# Dual Credit

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- Post-secondary tuition fees paid by the school district, through Ministry of Education funding.
- Dual credit programs are authorized through Ministry policy.
- Students are responsible for paying for textbooks, additional course supplies and tools, or personal safety equipment that might be necessary.



# Why take dual credit?

- Earn credits toward high school graduation & post-secondary simultaneously.
- Ease the transition to post-secondary.
- Get a head-start on a post-secondary credential, or trades training.
- Save money on the cost of post-secondary.
- An opportunity to explore deeper learning in an area of interest.
- Become an apprentice.
- Gain employment.



# Additional Points

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- Most academic courses students may take for dual credit are transferable between post-secondary institutions in B.C.
- In Surrey, students are able to participate in dual credit courses during the school year, and during the summer.
- In the 2018-2019 school year we had approximately 340 students engaged in dual credit and partnership programs.

## Child and Youth Care Program

(Douglas College)

Surrey students will have the opportunity to enroll in classes in the Child and Youth Care Program for dual credit. We will begin with one course this summer, with plans to expand.

## Emergency Medical Responder

(Justice Institute)

Students can earn 8 credits towards high school graduation as well as credits towards a JIBC transcript. Students will receive an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) certificate of completion and a Canadian Red Cross Basic Life Support certification. The EMR course is a pre-requisite to becoming a paramedic in BC.

# Tah-tul-ut\* Indigenous Education Pathway

(SFU)

Pathway for Indigenous students to become educators.

**Semester 1:** Students participate in an SFU dual credit course, *Education 252: Introduction to Reflective Practice*.

**Semester 2:** Students participate in the Surrey College 5-month *Education Assistant Program*.
