- Students deserve to have a say in their education, which helps shape their future.






What we want to do

- We've met with many politicians and school officials, such as the Hon. Melanie Mark, Trustee Norm Goldstein, and
- more.
 Our campaign has established teams in many districts across B.C. and has developed strong community support in each district.

Our objective by the end of this presentation is for the Surrey Board of Education to understand, support, and begin the implementation of a Student Trustee with partial trustee responsibilities to improve student representation within Surrey school district.

☐ Ontario implemented student trustees across all their school districts 1999 and districts have continued to elect student trustees ever since.

☐ The Ontario Student Trustee Association (OSTA) has been an effective, strong, and positive voice students

Implementation of student trustee has been very successful and students in Vancouver feel better represented

□ Example of direct effect on district, Vancouver student trustee's did a survey which resulted in funding for VSB school washrooms

Why we need a student trustee in Surrey

☐ Students must have a say on the decisions being made by the Board and the senior management team that are directly affecting them.

 Current issues affecting the district that could benefit from student input.



What a student trustee in Surrey could look like

In the Surrey school district, we believe a student trustee should...

- ☐ Have the ability to present motions, amendments, etc.
- ☐ Be a minimum age of 16 and a maximum of their last year of high school to run for office.
- Attend regular Board meetings, committee meetings, and the various other Board events.

- Be elected by their peers.
- ☐ Have non-binding voting power on matters facing the Board.

The positive impact a student trustee can have on the district



- Academic achievement and student engagement.
- ☐ Democracy and fair representation.
- Student insight can result in meaningful change in the school system.
- ☐ Youth develop decision making skills and learn the importance of voting.
- Better student body relations and diversity in the Board.
