Aboriginal

1982 Canadian Constitution.

"Aboriginal" is an oversimplification.

Aboriginal can be interpreted to mean "not original."

Doesn't recognize the diversity within the Indigenous communities in Canada.

Why Indigenous Peoples?

Recognizes that there is more than just one group.

Means "sprung from the land; native."

Connection to traditional territories and experiences of colonization.

Addressing all Indigenous groups as a collective.

The term Indigenous was chosen by Indigenous leaders.

Shift in Language


United Nations uses "Indigenous."

Indigenous Services Canada and Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada.

Indigenous Peoples' Assembly of Canada.

The BC Ministry of Education has moved to using Indigenous Education.
