

### Ministry Direction & Declarations




#### February 2018

BC Child Care Plan identifies school board owned property as potential location for child care spaces

#### July 2018

Minister Chen announces commitment to 22,000 new child care spaces

#### 2020

- School Act Sections 85.1 85.4
- Ministerial Child Care Order

## Child Care on School Property Policy

 Intent is to advance a more holistic system, ease transitions, support quality learning

- Policy guides boards of education in:
  - Directly operating school age care
  - Developing policy that promotes the use of the school property for child care
  - Child care space protection for provincially funded child care spaces
  - Agreements with third-party providers on school property

### Child Care in Surrey Schools

#### Current school sites with before and after school care

|                   | Before/After School Care | Preschool | Both Before/After School<br>Care & Preschool |
|-------------------|--------------------------|-----------|----------------------------------------------|
| Number of schools | 20                       | 10        | 21                                           |

- 942 registered spaces for before and after school care
- 2 operators lease land from us to operate child care programs (Old Yale Road & Harold Bishop)
- 4 new sites opened in 2020 2021

## Child Care in Surrey Schools

Projected new spaces for 2021 – 2022

- 5 new sites
  - 1 new renovation
  - 2 sites new before and after school care
  - 2 MCFD funded new construction

4 new sites possible by 2025

#### Capital projects

Input at design stage, timeline, process

### Complexities & Considerations

- Associated risks with a cost-recovery model
- Infrastructure to support direct service
- CUPE request for direct delivery service
- Third-party operators continue to seek additional spaces

### Potential Next Steps

- Focus on school age care
- Third-party operators continue to provide programming in existing sites
- Consider a small direct delivery pilot 1 − 3 sites
