#### Background:

The Business Development Department is responsible for identification, solicitation, confirmation and recognition of donors and sponsors for the District. The funding generated supports programs and services for Surrey students. These funds enhance, but do not replace government funding.

Funding opportunities are pursued through a variety of sources, including charities, foundations, businesses, corporations, community organizations and individual donors. This is accomplished by responding to calls for proposals, approaching prospective donors, nurturing relationships with past donors and researching potential funding opportunities.

For the twelve months ended June 30, 2021 the Business Development Department raised over \$5.8 million in donations and sponsorships, net of salaries and benefits required to secure the funds. The attached report and supporting schedules capture the many donations and sponsorships received by the district and documents how the proceeds of those donations support programs in schools.

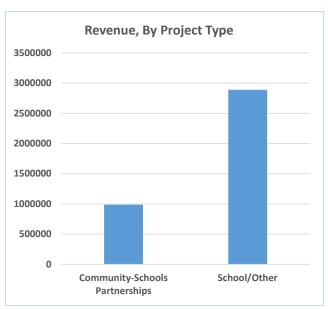
